DISCOVER FESTIVAL PARK

Come slide into one of Alberta's top 10 family destinations!

Located in downtown Whitecourt, Festival Park is the perfect spot for those looking to cool down in the summer and explore in the winter.


The paved walking trails that wind

around Festival Park are accessible for walkers, bikers, and rollers. Keep rolling north past Whitecourt's only Off-Leash Dog Park to connect to the Riverside Trail beside the Athabasca River.

Each year the Festival Park Pond is stocked with hundreds of rainbow trout for family fishing from May to October. In the winter, the Pond is cleared for skating and outdoor hockey.



WHITECOURT'S GREAT OUTDOORS



Known as the Snowmobile Capital of Alberta with over 485 kilometres of groomed trails in the area, Whitecourt is surrounded by boreal forested lands and numerous connecting rivers. In the summer, Whitecourt is a popular destination for camping, river boating, fishing, hiking, ATVing, mountain biking, and golfing. In the winter, many outdoor enthusiasts visit the community for hunting, snowmobiling, ice fishing, cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, and skating.



WHITECOURT TRAIL SYSTEM

Whether you're looking for exercise or to enjoy the great outdoors, Whitecourt's intricate trail system lets you explore more than 30 kilometres of trails that wind through the boreal forest in Whitecourt.

Paved pathways, meandering trails, and residential sidewalks will take you from the hilltop to the valley. The trails are designed for year-round use for walking, jogging, skating, and biking.

WILDLIFE

As a community surrounded by forests, wildlife sightings are not uncommon within town limits. Whitecourt's vast forests are home to deer, black bears, grizzly bears, cougars, moose, and coyotes. While it is extraordinary to run into wildlife here, please be advised to use caution when using the trail system and other outdoor recreation facilities.

How to prepare for wildlife:

- Keep dogs on leashes and be mindful of surroundings when walking area trails.
- Do not litter or leave food while exploring the area.
- Walk with friends or bring along a bell if walking alone in forested trails.

SNOWMOBILE CAPITAL OF ALBERTA

Snowmobiling is a popular winter recreation activity across Alberta, but with a large network of groomed trails and monthly snowfall of approximately 90 centimetres, Whitecourt is the Snowmobile Capital of Alberta.

The Whitecourt Trailblazers won the Alberta Snowmobile Association Excellence Award for Club in the North West Region in 2023.



WHITECOURT TRAILBLAZERS

Since 1979, the Whitecourt Trailblazers Club has been grooming trails and hosting annual rallies to bring sledders from across the region together. The Club, in partnership with Alberta Parks & Environment, currently maintains 485 kilometres of trail system in the Whitecourt area, including portions of the Great Canadian Trail and

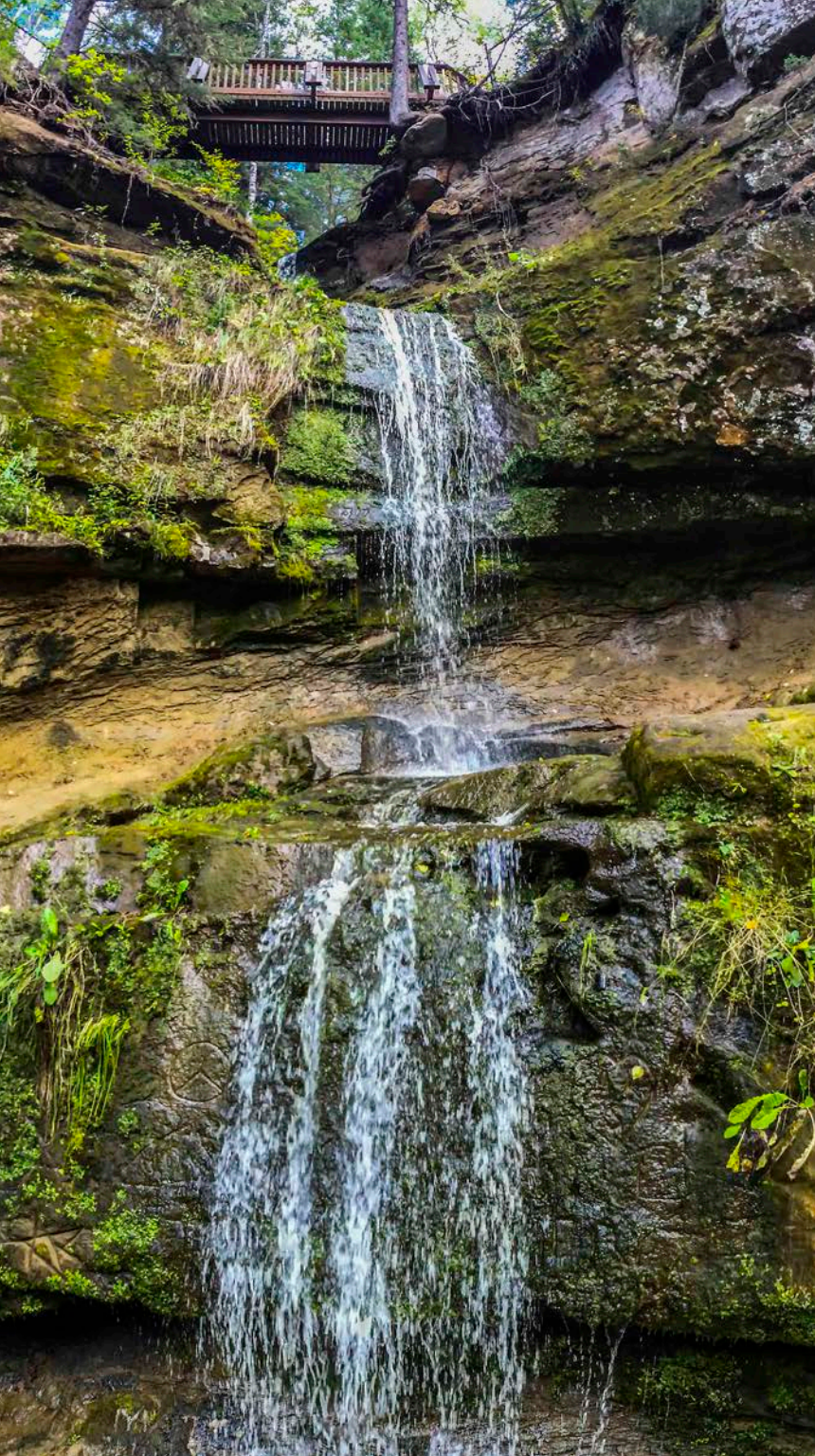
the Golden Triangle Trail System. It is recommended to use the designated staging areas at Eagle River and Groat Creek. In addition, there are three warm-up cabins on the trail system with incredible views from four lookouts.

THE GOLDEN TRIANGLE

The roughly 350 kilometre trail system loops through the boreal

forests linking Whitecourt, Fox Creek, and Swan Hills. Sledders from all over Canada come to shred the Golden Triangle to check it off their bucket list!

LET'S GO HIKING

Explore Whitecourt's surrounding area to discover incredible views in the boreal forest only a short drive from downtown Whitecourt.

Carved by Hard Luck Creek through the sandstone layers of the Paskapoo formation, Hard Luck Canyon is a unique geological feature you can't miss out on. During the summer you can catch the waterfall pouring from the top of the canyon.

Located just outside of Whitecourt in Woodlands County, parking is easily accessible from Range Road 125A for travellers. When you're ready to begin your adventure, follow the hard-packed gravel trail to the lookout bridge located at the canyon's edge for one of the best views.

Make sure to bring water, hiking shoes, snacks, and a camera to capture the Instagram-worthy scenery you're about to take in.

CARSON-PEGASUS PROVINCIAL PARK

One of the most popular destinations surrounding Whitecourt is the Carson-Pegasus Provincial Park located just 24 minutes away.

Travel 6 kilometres west on Highway 43 from Whitecourt, then travel another 11 kilometres north on Highway 32 until signs for the Park appear and continue following the directions shown.

The Park features an abundance of wildlife, including mule deer, moose, black bear, coyote, and lynx. Bird species also flock to the

area, including water birds like loons, blue jays, and black-capped chickadees. In addition to wildlife viewing, the Park is a destination for fishing enthusiasts. Additional activities include hanging out at the beach, water sports at McLeod Lake, hiking, camping, geocaching, and if you're lucky you can catch the aurora borealis dancing through the night.

The Backcountry Trail goes along the lakeshore for nearly 5.5 kilometres starting at the McLeod Lake boat launch. The Lakeshore Trail is a shorter 1.7 kilometre hike that follows the shore below the campground loops starting at the Peninsula boat launch.



MOUNTAIN BIKING




Whether you are a beginner, intermediate or advanced, Whitecourt's Mountain Bike Park is the ideal spot to spend an afternoon.

Located on the west side of town, the Park offers a variety of trails, dirt jumps, and drop zones to test your skills. For more information on bike trails visit:

CROSS-COUNTRY SKI TRAILS

What better way to enjoy a winter day than exploring the 4.5 kilometres of groomed cross-country ski trails located at the scenic Whitecourt Golf & Country Club.

Trails are groomed from mid-December through March and venture through the forested area and along the Athabasca River.

Access cross-country ski trails at the Whitecourt Golf & Country Club at 47 Street, the second gate north of Flats Road.

EASTLINK PARK

Eastlink Park is an affordable, fun, family hill for everyone to enjoy located off of 43 Avenue and 35 Street on 100 Rosko Lane.

The Park features 40 acres of skiable area, including 184-foot vertical drop, 550-foot Magic Carpet lift, and an 1100-foot T-Bar for the convenience of endless rides up and down the hill. There are 18 runs to shred from beginner, greens, and black diamonds. Try a new trick at the Terrain Park with rails, boxes, and jumps. Enjoy

an evening of night skiing with multiple light towers to light the slopes. In addition, speed down the 1200-foot C-shaped tube run.

Guests can take a break and warm up in the chalet or at the outside fire pit under a pole shed shelter. In addition, tubes, skis, and snowboards can be rented on-site.

Lessons need to be registered in advance. Helmets are mandatory for everyone using the hill.

WHERE THE RIVERS MEET

Two rivers flow through Whitecourt, the Athabasca and McLeod Rivers. Travelers can come and enjoy the beautiful scenery in the sacred spot where the original inhabitants, the Woodland Cree Nation, called "Sagitawah", *the meeting of the waters*.

The Athabasca River originates at the toe of the Columbia Glacier in Jasper National Park. The McLeod

River flows northeast down from the eastern slopes of the Canadian Rockies, beginning just outside the western border of Jasper National Park.

Venture to the Riverboat Park, located in Whitecourt off of Highway 43.

Bring your boat down to Whitecourt's boat launches and

enjoy a beautiful day on the water.

TUBING ON THE MCLEOD RIVER

PICTURE THIS: A warm day on the cool McLeod River surrounded by friends and family with a cold drink in your hand. This could be you!

A local recreational favourite, tubing down the McLeod River is a perfect way to take in Whitecourt's natural beauty and unwind.

Due to Whitecourt's active wildlife, it's common for travelers to see deer by the river enjoying a cold drink as well.

TUBING CHECKLIST:

- Good quality tube or floaty
- Water shoes
- Life jacket
- Hat
- Sunscreen
- Paddle for slow spots
- Rope to tie tubes together
- Drinks & snacks
- Two vehicles - one to park at the tubing access site & another for tube take out



OUTDOOR ENTHUSIASTS

Whitecourt and the surrounding area are hotspots for fishing and hunting, with stunning bodies of water and large forested areas.

HUNTING

In this neck of the woods, many prize animals have been hunted. Hunters must follow certain requirements before heading out as different species have different times for allowable hunting. Hunters can obtain their licence and learn more about regulations at alberta.ca

FISHING

One of the most popular destinations to fish near Whitecourt is Carson-Pegasus Provincial Park, located only 28 kilometres from Whitecourt. The Athabasca and McLeod Rivers are other great spots to cast a net and catch supper.

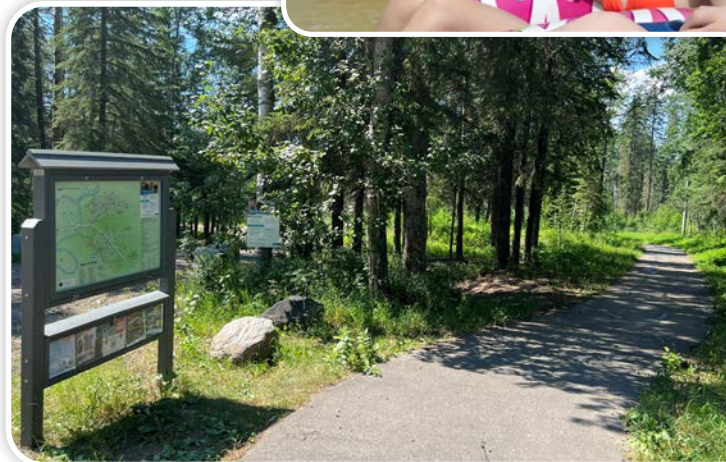
