MANDATE: To ensure the police needs of the community are met.

The Committee consists of:

- Mayor of the Town of Whitecourt
- 2 Town Councillors
- 1 Woodlands County Council Representative
- 2 Resident Public Members

*Public Members may be a resident of Whitecourt or a resident of Woodlands County within the cost share agreement area.

When are meetings held?

Committee meetings are held quarterly and typically scheduled at 12 noon on Mondays.

How much time does it take?

On average members commit 6-8 hours per year. An honorarium is provided to Public Members.

A Criminal Record Check is required

Public Members are required to submit a criminal record check with their application. This document will be used to consider the suitability of the candidate.

Committee Role:

Make budget and service level recommendations.

Promote community awareness of services.

In consultation with the RCMP, develop a yearly plan of priorities and strategies for municipal policing.

Provide community feedback to the RCMP concerning current policing.

Maintain confidentiality in regards to policing business that could potentially compromise programs, investigations, or services.
