



SUBDIVISION & DEVELOPMENT APPEAL BOARD

TAKE PART, GIVE BACK

MANDATE: To make decisions on appeals of subdivision or development decisions made by the Development Officer or Municipal Planning Commission.

The Committee consists of:

- 1 Town Council Representative
- 6 Public Members

No person who is a member of the Municipal Planning Commission can be appointed to act as a member of the Subdivision and Development Appeal.

All Public Members must reside within the Town of Whitecourt.

How much time does it take?

As provincial training is required for all members of the Board, Members will dedicate 12 hours every three years to training. Meeting commitments vary as the Board only meets when an appeal has been submitted. On average, the Board meets once every two to three years.

Committee Role:

To hear appeals as provided for by the Land Use Bylaw and the Municipal Government Act.

The Subdivision and Development Appeal Board is a statutory body intended to perform an independent adjudicative function that hears complaints and functions like a court. It is an administrative board mandated by the Municipal Government Act and created by a municipality to carry out appropriate functions and procedures.
